Hurricane Ida

St. James Parish continues to recover from Hurricane Ida, a Category 4 storm packing winds of some 150 miles per hour when it made landfall on the Louisiana coast.

"We activated our emergency plan for Ida before it hit St. James, doubling the number of deputies working days and nights throughout the storm and afterward," Sheriff Martin said. "Entergy reported that 100 per cent of the parish was without power with more than 30,000 utility poles damaged or destroyed and close to 36,000 spans of wire ripped from poles in St. James and St. John the Baptist Parishes. Our people literally worked 24 hours a day, doing all we could to maintain public safety and help anyone in need."

Our training facility on the West Bank served as an Incident Command Center, housing and deploying law enforcement personnel from across the state. Regrettably, one person was killed in Vacherie when a shed he was trying to secure collapsed.

Cyber Security

We have significantly enhanced our software, procedures and protocols to more completely defend our computer system from attacks. In November of 2019, St. James as well as numerous other parishes and municipalities across the state were hacked, causing major disruptions to government and law enforcement.

With assistance from federal, state and local Internet technology experts, we have totally re-built our system to shield vital data and limit access.

It is equally important that you take steps to safeguard your home and business networks. Hackers work tirelessly to break into systems, individual computers, tablets or mobile phones. Protect yourself and your personal information.

Pepper Ball Gun

A new less-than-lethal weapon is now available to SJPSO deputies that will help keep them safer in confrontations. Similar to a paint ball gun, it uses compressed air to fire a ball of potent pepper mix at a non-compliant suspect.

"Our number one goal in these situations is to de-escalate it without the use of excessive force," Sheriff Martin said. "Tasers and pepper spray can still be used in these settings, but this weapon allows officers to control a subject from a distance, as these situations can turn violent."

Deputies receive extensive training and must be certified before using the pepper ball gun. Two guns are available per shift and one is kept in the jail.

Drone Detection System

Many people enjoy flying drones and it's estimated that there are more than three million in use in the United States for business, news gathering, agricultural and recreational interests. But there are numerous areas where it is illegal to fly a drone, such as over certain industrial and governmental areas.

New technology acquired by the SJPSO detects when a drone is in use in the parish and if it is being flown over a restricted spot.

"We receive calls from businesses and private citizens as well as industry about drones being used in sensitive areas. Some plants use exclusive processes that must be protected," Sheriff Martin said. "It's one thing to fly it in a field or on the levee, but when you pilot it over your neighbor's fence or other private property and photograph people and things, it can potentially lead to criminal charges and confiscation of the drone."

Drones are required to be registered with the Federal Aviation Administration. Signing up is simple and easy at faadronezone.faa.gov.

Your Golf Cart or UTV

Golf carts and UTVs (Utility Terrain Vehicles or Side-by-Sides) can now be operated on parish roads providing the owner completes the permitting process. The vehicles must have standard safety features such as headlights, taillights, side mirrors and turn indicators. Additionally, owners must carry liability insurance and the UTV may not be operated by anyone without a valid driver's license.

Once the permit is approved, the owner will receive a sticker from our office that must be displayed on the vehicle. It is illegal to operate UTVs on state highways and four wheelers are not eligible for permitting. Contact our office for more information.

Your Bicycle

If your bicycle is registered with the SJPSO and it gets stolen, we can easily search our database and get it back to you when it's recovered. Many bicyclists, especially children, don't carry identification and in the event of a crash, we can identify the owner if the bike is registered at stjamessheriff.com.

Your Cameras

If your home or business has a video surveillance system, please register it with our office. Should something happen in your area, we may be able to gather important information from the recording. Visit our web site and sign up.
